

In the past year, effort has been made to organize items in the church with the goal of "putting like things together" so they can be more easily found and used. Below is progress made thus far:

**Crying Room:** There are two new Pack & Plays (with mattresses & sheets), a new cover for the changing station, and two new rockers.

**Toddler Nursery:** Toys have been sorted and broken/unsafe toys discarded. **Room 102:** This is now a (temporary) storage room. Tables, chairs, extra video equipment, electrical cords etc. are stored here, including in the tall cabinet. Anything in this room must be labeled.

**Room 104:** This provides storage for various children's programs, even those not presently active. Anything in this room must be labeled.

**Sheds:** 1) The shed closest to Miller Hall has miscellaneous plywood, wood, signs, sports equipment, etc. It is in need of replacement, however a repair may be attempted this fall. Do not store anything in this shed until the shed is repaired or replaced.

- 2) The newer shed was purchased by Faith Preschool and Friendship Circle for their storage needs.
- 3) The pavilion shed is used for garden equipment and to store coolers from the chicken barbecue, tents, lawn mowing equipment, etc.

**Historical Records:** Documents have been compiled to be organized and digitized accordingly. Equipment will be provided. To assist with this project, contact Laura Lillie (lalillie@verizon.net).

**Looking Ahead:** Future plans include cleaning the attic and reviewing books in the Library/Parlor and Choir Room. This effort may require the disposal of old and worn items. Please let us know if you have concerns about items in these areas.
