Are you in need of a "Summer Slow-Down?" If so, here are a few ideas:

Back to Nature

The psalmist says:

"The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands."
Psalm 19:1 NIV

Nature is like a never-ending love letter from our Creator, and summer is a wonderful time to read it! Each season reveals something new and beautiful, if we only take a moment to look around. Take a prayer walk or bike ride with the sole purpose of noticing and giving thanks for the beauty God has surrounded you with. Even in the city, there are vibrant signs of life that reflect his handiwork.

Unplug and Reconnect

This may be the most difficult (but the most necessary) thing for many of us today. Close the laptop. Silence the phone, even for a few minutes. Instead of looking for joy or fulfillment on the screen, stop and receive what God has for you right here, right now. Look at the people around you, wherever you are - the park, the

grocery store line, the office. Really look at them. Give thanks for all the beautifully different lives God has created. Or maybe you're at home and there's a little one trying to get your attention. Let them show you that new discovery; watch them blow bubbles or run through the sprinkler; wave down the ice cream truck this time, and share some sticky sweetness. Remember: when we're staring at our screens, we're only half living. Children can help us find joy in the moment if we'll do our part by unplugging, even for a little while.

Just Breathe

A deep breath sounds so simple, but how often do you really stop to take one? Pause right now, breathe in slowly for six seconds and out for six seconds (Make sure the air fills your belly!) Can you feel how it calms your body? Just as God gives us peace in our spirits, he gives us ways to calm our bodies too. Place a little reminder somewhere to take a few of these breaths each day. Before you know it, you'll have the habit of stopping regularly to refresh.

Change It Up

Routine and repetition are two things that can steal our attention from the blessings in our daily lives. We become so used to taking this road, looking out that window, eating this breakfast, or seeing that familiar face, we start to miss what God is doing right in front of us. Why not take the long way home from somewhere this summer? Visit a Farmer's Market and taste a few things you've never tried before. Maybe look out your kitchen window with new eyes. Focus on what has changed since the last time you really paid attention. See where God shows up in unexpected ways.

There are so many ways to savor His blessings this summer! Why not start by making a list of your own - not another boring "to-do" list, but a 'get-to-do' list! Get excited about the possibilities and see what adventures God has in store!

“FAITHFUL FOOTSTEPS”

Dear Church Friends and Family,

One thing you’ll all hear from me often is that I love to go hiking and spend time in nature. I love to climb mountains and go on walks besides creeks and streams. One of the reasons for this is because nature is simply calming. I think the main reason I love hiking is because I connect with God so easily in the woods. There is something about that area that makes prayers flow from my lips and opens my heart and ears to hear God’s words for me. Those words are frequently encouraging, so I want to leave you all with some advice and encouragement as well.

In John 15, Jesus instructs his disciples to “abide in him.” Abide is another way of saying live. It carries the meaning of living in the same house as somebody else. In other words, Jesus is asking us to share our daily lives with him, like we share our lives with those who live in our homes. When we do, he says we will bear fruit (John 15:6). Fruit could mean a lot of things. It could mean the fruits of the Spirit, which are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Fruit could also mean the ways we love others and improve their lives when we follow the example of Jesus, like learning to do chores by watching your parents do it as a kid. Either way, the message is clear, life is better when we spend time with God. God wants to connect with you and grow joy, peace, and love in you.

That’s certainly my experience. That’s one of the reasons I go hiking. Because there I talk to God, and in talking to God, I find peace. I know summer is a busy time. For some of us it is even busier than the rest of the year because we are running around doing so much. My advice is to make sure you spend time with Jesus, even on the days you might not feel like it. God grows good fruit in you when you do.

Here are some great ways our church can help you spend some quality time with Jesus this summer.

1. Be generous with Jesus. You can take time with Jesus to shop for Faith Preschool’s bucket list or Missions’ school supply drive. You can think with Jesus of who you want to give your money or time to, whether that is our church or others in need.
2. Worship with Jesus and each other. Our next Holy Communion Sunday is August 4. During worship this summer, I am focused on sharing personal stories in my sermons to help you all get to know me better. Because God’s stories are our stories.
3. Fellowship with Jesus. Keep your eyes peeled for announcements for Kid’s Club activities. And “Pizza with the Pastor” is July 18 & 25 both at 6:00 p.m. Our Chicken BBQ is September 7 and Apple Fest is October 13. Mark your calendars! We will need people to serve for these ministries.

You can donate blood on August 2 at our Blood Drive. You can help with Chicken BBQ and the Apple Fest. And you can be gracious hosts to the Girl Scouts who are already ramping up for the fall. Lastly, you can serve on the various committees we have for ministry. You could even serve as a Finance Chair.

May this summer be full of fun, full of blessings, and full of Jesus for you all!

A MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

Greetings, good people!

As part of our recent meetings, we wanted to share information with you relative to the financial situation of the church. Please read the following and, as always, if you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact a member of the Finance Committee. Contact information can be found below.

To begin, we wish to thank everyone for supporting QUMC with your “prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness.” In our recent baptism and membership services, we heard once more how these are the core aspects of membership and life within any local church.

As we approach the midpoint of the year, we have observed some trends. Please see the following:

- General Fund
 - The congregation has given generously to special offerings, however general giving has been declining, not keeping up with inflation.
 - The current balance of \$12,370 in our Acts 4 fund, used to help those in the congregation in need of financial assistance, is sufficient for now.
 - Please prayerfully consider increasing your general giving by 10-15%.
- General operating expenses are the driving point of the General Fund
 - As our building ages, our building maintenance costs increase.
 - Between 2019 and 2023, staff payroll and expenses increased 4.5%.
 - Utilities increased 10.4%.
 - Despite these increases, we have worked diligently to keep the overall increase in operating expenses to 5.3%.
- **General giving, the funds used to pay operating expenses, has decreased 7.4%. Our general balance at the end of 2023 was -\$9,345.64. This deficit has grown each month.**
 - Our primary bank account contains both designated (restricted) and general (unrestricted) funds.
 - We have been slow to distribute some designated giving because of the need to maintain a positive bank balance.
 - Each type of fund is tracked, and distributions are made when funds are available.
- Church Programs and Teams are doing their part
 - Church programs are not running high or over budget.
 - Several programs are deliberately not spending as much knowing the financial needs of the church.

Let's keep our ministry and church alive and thriving as we enter the second half of 2024.

From Jim Newcomer, on behalf of Quakertown Cares:

"We have a senior citizen, who with her husband, has been raising their two young grandchildren who attend our schools. The children's mother is incarcerated for drug offenses, their father disappeared. The grandparents have been living and supporting the grandkids from their social security checks. They live in an apartment. This family lives in a rental, but it is not an apartment, a small house where the rent is more than the grandmother's monthly social security disability check. She had worked in a convalescent home until her knees gave out from the lifting. Her landlord is working with her, but still she is already behind.

Several weeks ago the grandfather died. The children's grandfather was a proud ex-Marine, but they had no savings and still owe a local cremation mortuary who has given them a payment plan. The grandmother can't seek child support from the absentee father because he has a violent history, is now out-of-state and recently out of jail. The grandmother has a PFA in place to protect them.

Part of our assistance will be a borough family pool membership so that the children will have something this summer to keep them active under these terribly unfortunate circumstances. We will also assist with groceries.

This grandmother fears homelessness. Your June and July special offerings will go to this family, as well as a contribution from an individual, and our Cares funds.

When I told the grandmother that Cares and a supportive church will assist, she was emotionally appreciative.

I reached this grandmother in line at the borough pool on this scorching day. The boys are very, very happy that you have already made their summer!”

Also from Jim...

“Thank you for the \$400 in donations from your June special collection. We appreciate the Missions Committee adding on from reserves. The grandmother receiving this will be exceedingly appreciative of the congregation’s generosity. I spoke with her about a foundation that can provide her with clothes, supplies, etc. so we are trying to organize resources to help. She is the most thankful recipient that I have ever heard back from.

While we realize that you do not necessarily hold a special collection every month, when next you do we would again plan to dedicate it to this senior and her young grandsons.

I hope that you are enjoying your summer and also pray that your new pastor is a true ‘Godsend.’”
